

### Network Security by Dana McKittrick

There are many "home networks" in Hearthstone alone. And you would be amazed at how many are completely unsecured. Within 3 houses in either direction, most of us can find no less than 2 other networks. Basic

security is generally all that is needed. What a snoop can't see, they won't know about. All home networks that I am familiar with offer at least a couple of ways to secure your wireless network. Take the time to read your router manual on Broadcasting and WEP or WPA security. A Firewall alone is not an adequate solution. That way you won't get the message that someone else is logged into your network when you're supposed to be the last one logging off for the day!

# Street Light Maintenance by Scott Matthews

Four streetlight bulbs were recently replaced by Duke power. To report a streetlight outage, call Duke power's 24 hour customer service at 704-594-9400. Be prepared to give

the address of the streetlight when you call. Duke power responds to the call within a few days. Let's keep Hearthstone safe with well lit streets.



Be sure you keep your home network secure. Be sure you are not broadcasting your network name.

The most needed food items at the moment are canned or packaged foods including: chicken, beef stew, peanut butter, mac and cheese dinners, ham, tuna, dried beans, turkey, salmon, chili. Also canned item including fruit, juices, vegetables, evaporated milk Packaged items and soup. such as cereal, baking mixes, oatmeal, and powdered milk are very welcome. Nonfood items that are appreciated include paper products, personal hygiene items and cleaning supplies. All non

perishable donations are appreciated and the items needed are not limited to the items above. Grab a grocery bag or box and clean out some of those unused items or multiples in your pantry and help someone in need!

### Hearthstone Web Site Tips by Trevor Hancock

Happy May, everyone! I have two website (<u>www.HearthstoneNeighborhood.com</u>) tips for y'all this time around: pictures and avatars.

Posting pictures to <a href="www.HearthstoneNeighborhood.com">www.HearthstoneNeighborhood.com</a>. The picture posting process is really simple: just send them to me in e-mail, to admin@HearthstoneNeighborhood.com. If you have photos that you'd like to see posted on our website, be they of a personal or community nature, simply send them to me, along with a caption for each, and I will see that they're posted. Pretty simple, huh?

In the context of our website, avatars are no more than a little picture associated with your profile. If you visit the forums and see any of the posts I have made as "Admin" or "TrevorH", you will see that the posts are accompanied by an avatar. If you'd like your own avatar on the website, here's how:

Log into www.HearthstoneNeighborhood.com

Click your login name in the upper right-hand corner of the screen. This will take you to your profile editor where you can enter personal information, such as your signature, bio, and your e-mail address. You can also configure site options here, as well as set up an avatar.

Click the "Avatar" tab.

Select "Yes" for "Enable Avatar".

Click the "Browse" button next to the "Upload Avatar" box and locate a picture on your local computer to use as an avatar. NOTE: for best performance the picture will be shrunk to a size of around 80 x 80 pixels when uploaded, so you should choose a pretty small one to begin with.

When you've selected your picture, click the "Update" button. This will upload the picture to the website and complete the process.

In about 10 minutes your avatar (picture) will be available and you will start seeing it associated with your new posts in the discussion forums. Head on over to the "General Chat" forum, say hello and check it out!
